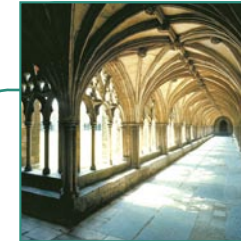

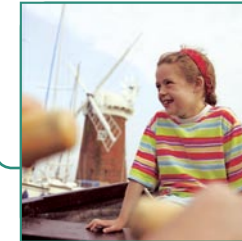
In **St Albans**, climb the gentle green hill to the splendid 11th-century cathedral for a fascinating historical adventure, and immerse yourself in England's Roman past.
